- Annual tax credit, can be retroactive
- Available for disabled adults and a family with a disabled child

- Wheelchair services
- ⇒ The Assistive Technology Support Program now offers individuals 50% reimbursement of the cost of an assistive technology device up to a maximum of \$2,500 or the unfunded amount, whichever is lesser.

For individuals 18 years of age or older who are full-time wheelchair users and have seating and mobility related issues that cannot be met through community-based therapy resources.

May help find additional funding/services for children

Community Living disABILITY Services (\$\)

May help find additional funding/services for adults with intellectual disabilities

Manitoba Health, Seniors and Active Living [Provincial]

Prosthetic and Orthotic Program (\$\)

In most cases, Manitoba Health pays 100% for orthotics and prosthetics Must be prescribed by a medical professional and provided by a certified prosthetist/orthotist.

- Limb prosthetic devices and services
- Limb and spinal orthotic devices and services

Employment and Income Assistance (\$\)

Health-related supplies or equipment not provided by other programs

Quality of Life Grants - Equipment Provision Program

May provide funding for:

- Mobility Aids: manual wheelchairs, power wheelchairs, walkers, scooters
- Personal Care: shower chairs, bath lifts, bath transfer board, grab bars, safety rails
- ⇒ Home: patient lifts, lift chairs, hospital beds, mattresses, air conditioners

Muscular Dystrophy Canada – Western Canada

Must be registered client of Muscular Dystrophy Canada

Funds up to \$3,000 per client per year

Funding is available for:

- Access Equipment (ramps, lifts),
- Bathroom Aids,
- Mobility (wheelchairs, walkers, scooters) and repairs & modifications.

Muscular Dystrophy, Safeway Mobility Grant

Must be registered with Muscular Dystrophy Canada

Funding is available for:

- Mobility aids: wheelchairs, walkers and scooters
- Seating and position aids: specialty cushions, power tilt and lift chairs
- Orthopaedic devices: leg braces, AFOs and orthopaedic splinting
- Access equipment: stair glides, porch lifts and ramps
- Bathing devices



Rehabilitation Centre for Children

Services are provided for:

Prosthetic/Orthotic Department (\$\forall\$)

- Children and youth up to the age of 21 from Manitoba, Northwestern Ontario and Nunavut are eligible for services
- Children and youth can be referred to the Prosthetic and Orthotic Department by parents or guardians and various medical professionals.
